RULES AND REGULATIONS

All entries in the Family Department will be subject to the general rules and regulations published in this catalog.

1. **ELIGIBILITY:** All articles must be clean and in good condition. No articles may be exhibited for prizes that are not listed in this catalog. All entries must be in the names of the craftsman. Articles exhibited in previous Fairs will no be eligible to compete for prizes. Only residents of Jackson County and for a member of Extension related organization and those who attend Jackson County School district and / are home school in Jackson county are eligible.

Only Non-Professional participants may compete. Persons not receiving the majority of their income from the category entered.

2. **IDENTIFICATION:** I.D. Tags for all entries will be at the County extension Office that you may pick up ahead of time. This will show exhibitors name, phone number, and will be attached to the entry. Clothing must have coat hangers to be displayed on.

3. **ENTRY Age Groups:**

- Preschool and under (not eligible for scholarship)
- Sub-Junior-----Kindergarten 5-9 yrs. Old
- Junior-----10-13 yrs. Old

4. **AWARDS AND POINTS:** All entries will be scored and Awarded ribbons and point as follows: **A High Point Youth** (selected from Blue Ribbons) will be awarded during the Livestock Auction

In addition, a Grand Champion and Reserve Champion winner may be selected from the blue ribbon winners in each class, depending

on the discretion of the judges. The Grand and Reserve winners will be awarded a small rosette.

- A "*Best of Show*" winner will be chosen from all the Grand Champion winners and awarded a trophy.
5. **DUPLICATION**: There will be no duplication of entries. Judgment of duplication is left up to the discretion of the appropriate Division Chairman.

Baked Products



Rules:

Each baked product entry must be accompanied by the recipe. Recipe must be legible and neat on an 8 ½ x 11in piece of paper, with the exhibitor's name on the back. A recipe book will be made from these cards. Entries will be received on Thursday morning before 9:00am, October 9, 2008. Judging will begin at 9:00am. Please tell the Chairman if you wish to donate the rest of the baked good to the fair or pick up your item no later than 12:00 NOON.

Classes:

1. Breads (Cinnamon rolls, Kolaches)
 - a. Yeast
 - b. Quick Breads

Whole loaves will need to be placed in Gallon Ziploc bags. Two (2) roll, etc. will be on a 6" plate in a Ziploc bag. (bread machine permitted, but homemade ingredients used).

2. Candy
4 on 6" plate in Ziploc bag

3. Cookies and Cookie Bars (Brownies)
 - A. Homemade
 - B. MixPlace 4 on 6" plate in Ziploc bag

4. Pies and Cheesecakes
(Custard pies will be judged this year, as long as kept cool by participant)
 - A. Homemade (Homemade filling and crust)
 - B. Mix/Bought CrustWhole pie will need to be placed in Ziploc bag.

5. Cakes
 - A. Homemade
 - B. MixWhole cake to be placed in clear wrap or Ziploc bag.

6. Miscellaneous
Cobblers; specialty food recipes
Whole cobbler to be placed in clear wrap or Ziploc bag.

7. Decorated ***** (The cake will not be tasted; may use Styrofoam or formable cake to be judged) Only decorating will be judged.

1. All canned goods must be exhibited in standard canning jars. (Kerr or Ball) and must be in $\frac{1}{4}$ pint up to 1 quart sized standard jars. Each must have complete closure, (includes screw band). Odd shape jars and closures will not be accepted. Check the side of the jar for Ball or Kerr name. (If the company name is on the bottom of the jar, it is not a standard jar). Jars, lids, and bands, must be clean and free of rust.
 2. No adhesive labels are to be placed on entries.
 3. Do not write name on top of jar lid.
 4. You can write the name of the contents on the lid
 5. Write name of canned good on entry ticket.

All entries must be grown by the exhibitor and grown in Jackson County for at least six (6) months. No exhibitor may enter duplicate entries in any one class and all cut flowers must be displayed in small bottles, furnished by the flower department. No commercially grown exhibit will be eligible for judging, but may be displayed for educational purposes. Plants should be clean, manicured and not sprayed with leaf gloss.

All entries must have the common name of the plant in plain view; this may be done using a Popsicle stick type marker.

RULES:

All entries in the art department will be subject to the general rules and regulations published elsewhere in this catalog.

Only entries from 3rd grade - 12th grade will be judged.

Preschool - 2nd grade entries will be awarded a ribbon. Ribbons will be delivered or mailed to a school or daycare if requested. These should be attached to the individual entries before they are mounted to craft paper. If ribbons are not available ahead of time, attach the artwork to craft paper so that a ribbon can be stapled to it.

Preschool - 12th grade pictures drawn at school will be limited to one entry per student.

Preschool - 12th graders may enter one other picture created at home.

A grand champion and reserve champion will be selected from each grade level for grades 6th - 12th, if merited.

A Youth Best of Show will be selected from the grand champion's grades 6th - 12th.

Youth Best of Show winner will be awarded a savings bond if he/she meets the eligibility guidelines described in the AWARDS section of the Family Department Rule Book, including participation in the first clean-up day at the fairgrounds.

Artwork created at home must be framed and ready to hand or attached (preferably with glue) to tag board or construction paper so that it can be stapled to the wall or hung from a peg board without damaging the picture.

For artwork created at school, Preschool to 5th Grade:

Please attach the artwork to craft type paper (30" - 36" wide x 7' long) to be hung vertically. Any class craft paper longer than 7 feet will be cut off.

To ensure there is adequate wall space for everyone to display their artwork, schools are encouraged to combine as many entries per sheet of craft paper as possible.

Artwork should be attached to the craft paper with staples, hot glue or Elmer's glue. Rubber cement, tape, stick glue and glue dots are not recommended due to the humidity in the art building.

Decorating with candy or food items is not recommended due to humidity, insects and rodents.

Each entry should either have a white entry tag with name, school and grade on it in the upper right hand corner to which a ribbon will be stapled after judging, or should be attached to the craft paper such that a ribbon can be stapled directly to the artwork after judging.

Each individual, school or daycare must have their own representative to DELIVER, HANG, and PICK UP artwork. Bring the following supplies: small step stool, stapler, staple gun, staples, pliers, and glue.
